- Played professional baseball in the minors (Can Am League, NY-Penn League, Georgia-Florida League & Middle Atlantic League).
- Scouted for the Dodgers & Royals.
- Named a Schenectady Patroon in 1959.

THE 1954 SCHENECTADY LITTLE LEAGUE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

On August 27, 1954, the Schenectady Little League team defeated Colton, California 7-5, in the Eighth Little League World Series in Williamsport, Pennsylvania. The fourteen member squad was led by Schenectady Little League patriarch, Mike Maietta.

The 1954 World Championship team:

- Won ten consecutive games leading to the Little League title.
- Qualified for the Little League World Series with a 6-0 victory over Sound View, Bronx.
- Played three games in the 1954 Little League World Series at Williamsport:
 - Defeated Lakeland, Florida, 16-0, in the quarter finals (future major leaguer Boog Powell played for Lakeland).
 - Defeated Masontown, Pennsylvania, 5-3 in the semi-finals.
 - Defeated Colton, California (with future major leaguer Ken Hubbs), 7-5, in the World Championship game on August 27, 1954.
- Did not give up a run for 38 consecutive innings during the tournament.
- All team members were students in the Schenectady City School District.

The 1954 Schenectady Little League team will be inducted into the Schenectady City School District Athletic Hall of Fame on the 50th Anniversary of the 1954 Little League World Championship.
